A meeting was convened with the Browsing Centres Owners' Association to discuss the various guidelines to implement the stipulated conditions for the functioning of browsing centres. The following conclusions were arrived at:

1. It was decided to insist only for a reliable identity from the browser since the members opined that each and every browser may not possess Government identity with them.
2. It would not be possible for all the parents to accompany their children to the browsing centres.
3. A suggestion was made to install a CCTV in all browsing centres to capture the image of the browser one frame every 30 seconds and keep the data stored for a month.
4. Though it is not possible to block the browsing of pornographic movies or pictures at the browsing centres, they should see that no browser misuses the system for pornographic photos or movies. However the possibilities to be looked into in consultation with the ISPs.

5. With regard to parking of vehicles, the browsing centres should provide two-wheeler parking space in the ratio of half the number of system available in the centre. However, new browsing centres applying for licence should provide enough parking space for two-wheelers.
6. The browsing centres should fulfill all the conditions specified by 30th April 2008 in order to enable the local Inspector of Police to conduct an inspection and give his report.
7. Validity period of the licence to be extended to 3 years would be looked into.
8. A fire extinguisher to be installed in all the centres.
9. Processing work for issuance of licence to be completed in about a month's time.
10. The members requested that whenever any offence takes place, they should not be asked to keep the centre closed for a long period which would ultimately affect their business.

2) While winding up the meeting, the Additional Commissioner of Police made it clear that those centres failing to fulfill the stipulated conditions by the end of May would be asked to pull down their shutters.
